

Wrapping up our 40th Year

What a year this has been! As we look back at 2017, we are thankful for the many successes achieved through your financial support and by our hard-working trainers and staff members. Here are just a few of this year's highlights:

Placements

This fiscal year beginning in July, your generous support allowed us to professionally train and place 6 Hearing Dogs nationwide, with another 3 dogs soon to be tested for placement. The Adoption Services team found homes for 18 Career Change Dogs, and we performed 16 follow-up visits with clients in Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Oregon, Michigan, New York, Alaska, Washington and Tennessee. These visits are crucial to the commitment we make for the lifetime of our clients and dogs!



Second Training Facility

In November 2016, we broke ground on our 18,852 sq. ft. Second Training Facility that will allow us to train and place even more Assistance Dogs with clients nationwide. This year, much progress has been made in the construction phase, and we are scheduled to move in late spring/early summer.

Puppy Program

Wynne, our gorgeous yellow Labrador, gave birth to her first litter of pups in August! We are forever grateful to Dogs with Wings for partnering with us in our journey to grow our new puppy program specific to the future Autism Assistance Dog placements.
